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APPENDIX C: Partially Legible Issue V Coins

A large number of the *leeuwengroten* in the Stedelijk Museum Zutphen (SMZ) collection are partially or completely illegible on one face or both. Although many of these specimens add little or nothing to our knowledge of the *leeuwengroot per se*, it is our intention to provide photographs of all of the remaining coins from the Zutphen Hoard, regardless of condition. Rather than bog down the main text with numerous, unnecessary photos, we felt it better to place these 84 coins here in a separate appendix.

Most of these coins will have come from the common Issue V, Type 12. However unlikely, it is possible that some of them are missing the crossbars from the **A**'s on the obverse, and would therefore be classified as Issue VI coins. A comparison of the still-visible aspects of the coins with known examples from Issue VI helps eliminate certain pieces as being possible Issue VI coins. This can be difficult, however, since the lettering of Issue VI coins is very similar to that of some of the Issue V, 'rough' style coins.

The presence of a footless N in FLAND on the obverse puts this coin in the 'footless' N group. 'Footless' N's in the reverse, outer legend can be found on both the 'footless' N and 'rough' style groups

<u>'Wedge' L's / 'sharp' C's</u> (54 coins)

Coins with these attributes do not come from the sub-groups 'curvy' L or 'serif' L. These coins are likely to belong to either the 'refined' or 'rough' style groups.

Coins with clear 'wedge' L's and 'sharp' C's: (36 coins)

Most of these coins seem to have 'normal', long **O**'s and indent **D**'s. Most have 'rough' style leaves, but a few have 'refined' style marks.
