

# A Preliminary Look at the *Leeuwengroten* of the Lordship of Serain

The *leeuwengroot* (*gros au lion*, *gros compagnon*, *gezel*, *socius*) was a (nominally) silver coin, struck in the 14<sup>th</sup> century in Western Europe, and in particular, in the Low Countries. The type was first minted in Flanders (or perhaps in Brabant) in June 1337, in response to the devaluation of silver coins in France earlier that same year. The type was quickly imitated in the neighboring regions, on occasion as a “coin of convention” mandated by agreements between multiple realms.

The earliest *leeuwengroten* of 1337 were minted in Flanders and Brabant, and probably in Holland and Namur as well. Later imitations in Hainaut, Guelders, Cambrai and other places made an appearance. The type was abandoned around October, 1343, but minting restarted in Flanders in January, 1346, and the imitations soon followed once again. Minting continued until 1364, when the type was replaced by the *plak* series of lion-with-helm coins (also widely imitated).

Literature regarding the Lordship of Serain is all but non-existent. It was apparently a fief of Cambrai, held by the Lords of Crèvecœur, but that is about all we know. Imitation *grand blanc* and lion-with-helm coins from Serain are known, i.e. the widely imitated coins struck in Flanders before and after the *leeuwengroot*, respectively. But the most common of all Serain coins are the imitation *sterlings*, or *esterlins*.

There are two basic types of Serain *leeuwengroot*, one with an initial eagle on the obverse and a single-tailed central lion, the other with an initial cross and a double-tailed central lion.

### **Walerand II of Ligny 1304-1353 & 1364-1366<sup>[4]</sup>**

Based upon the reverse, inner legend, the coins were clearly struck for someone named Walerand (Valéran, etc.), but exactly who this person was is unclear. Théry and Poey d'Avant ascribe the coins to a Walerand III, but the dates that they give for him are either incorrect (Théry) or “post-leeuwengroot” (Poey).

Duplessy (ref. 4) gives the dates provided above, saying that Waleran II ceded his lands to his son (John I) in 1353, receiving them back in 1364 when John died (p. 54).

The central lion has a single tail; he may also have a crown on his head (3 pellets?). The mark after MONETA is unusual and unique. The border leaves are the same as those of Brabant or Flanders: . This type was first reported by Théry (*RBN* 1924, ref. 11), using this specimen (*BN FRBNF44990457h*). The initial eagle indicates a coin that was probably struck before 1346.

Presumably, the reverse legend reads: WALERanDOs LINEO, or *Waleran of Ligny*. Note that both the *Two O's by the cross arms* and the *First O round, second O long 'rules'* have been followed.

The central lion has a double tail, the ends of which have no tufts. The obverse legend is slightly odd, and apparently reads MONETA SEEREN. The unusual letter ♦ on the obverse is the same as the ♦ in VVALLERANDVS on the reverse. Gone are the Ligny title and any attempt to follow the *Two O's by the cross arms* 'rule'. The initial cross indicates a coin that was probably struck 1346 or thereafter, although the Roman N's in the reverse, outer legend are unusual. The lobes of the border leaves are thinner than those of the previous type: .

### SERAIN.

J'ai peu de renseignements sur Serain. On sait seulement que c'était un fief situé dans le Cambrésis, et qu'il relevait de Crevecoeur. Suivant M. Desains (*Revue num. fr.*, 1842, pag. 133), c'était un des anciens apanages des maisons de Saint-Aubert et de Walincourt, et, avant 1313, les seigneurs de ce fief jouissaient du droit de battre monnaie. Par les espèces venues jusqu'à nous, nous voyons que cette terre a appartenu aux seigneurs de Liguy, et qu'ils y avaient établi un atelier, qui fonctionna assez activement.

La numismatique de Serain ne nous était connue que par un petit nombre de pièces publiées par Duby, et par deux gros au cavalier armé dessinés dans la *Revue*. Je suis heureux de l'avoir enrichie d'une manière tout à fait remarquable.

It is highly unlikely that the third letter (G) in the second word in the obverse legend is correctly depicted in this drawing.

## Deerlijk Hoard (1894)

CHRONIQUE DES TROUVAILLES. — Nous devons à l'obligeance d'un confrère les renseignements suivants :

On vient de trouver à Deerlyk, arrondissement de Courtrai, près de l'emplacement de l'ancien château, deux petits pots, contenant l'un environ quinze pièces d'argent de Louis de Male et de divers souverains de l'époque — entre autres un gros au lion de Waleran III, de Luxembourg, frappé à Serain ; — l'autre vingt et une pièces d'or dont voici la nomenclature :



“...un gros au lion de Waleran III, de Luxembourg, frappé à Serain; ...”

...which is not really very much information at all. The coin could be a *grand blanc*, or even a lion-with-helm coin. We are not told if any of the 15 Flemish coins of Louis of Male (1346-1384) were *leeuwengroten* or not. The whereabouts of the Serain *leeuwengroot* (?) from the Deerlijk Hoard (1894) are currently unknown.

The whereabouts of the Serain *leeuwengroten* from the Schoo Hoard (1927) are currently unknown [52]. Suhle reported 3 (p. 87) or 4 “fragments” (p. 83) [10]. Note the final N (not Ω) in the transcription, which may be incorrect. See ref. 52 for more information.
