

# **Another Previously Unpublished, Short-Cross, Fractional *Leeuwengroot* of the County of Holland**

Fractional *leeuwengroten* stuck for William V, Count of Holland (1354 - 1389) are fairly rare, and those with a short cross on the reverse (as opposed to a long cross) are even more rare. They are known from a meager handful of specimens.

A new and previously unpublished type of fractional *leeuwengroot* has recently come up for auction.

This coin has legends and interpunction that are not listed in Grolle's *De Muntstag van de Graven van Holland* book (ref. 3) nor in van der Chijs' *De munten der voormalige graafschappen Holland en Zeeland* (ref. 1). Furthermore, we have never seen such a type ourselves nor published any report on such a coin.

Grolle (ref. 3) lists 2 sorts of short-cross "1/4 *leeuwengroten*" (with a third sort added by van Herwijnen & v.d. Koppel, i.e. **Grolle —**):

**17.2.4 B a**

**17.2.4 B b**

[**17.2.4 B c** – added by van Herwijnen & v.d. Koppel, ref. 5]

The new coin under discussion is not a **Grolle 17.2.4 B a** because the obverse legend reads HOLLANDIE and not HOLLAN, and the reverse legend reads GVILELM and not GVILLELMVS. Furthermore, the 8 interpunction on the coin does not technically match any coin reported by Grolle (who does not distinguish between : and 8, and gives only :).

The new coin is not a **Grolle 17.2.4 B b** because the obverse legend begins with MONETA and not some form of GVILELM(VS).

The new coin is not a "**Grolle 17.2.4 B c**" (added to Grolle's catalog by van Herwijnen & v.d. Koppel, ref. 5) because the obverse legend begins with MONETA and not some form of GVILELM(VS).

Whether or not the coin is a half *groot*, or a quarter *groot* is up for discussion. In any case, we were unable to find any previous reports of any fractional, short-cross *leeuwengroot* coin struck for William V of Holland with these legends.
